Principal Dr. A.K. Srivastava appreciated the efforts of the NSS Volunteers and gave best wishes for the upcoming activities.





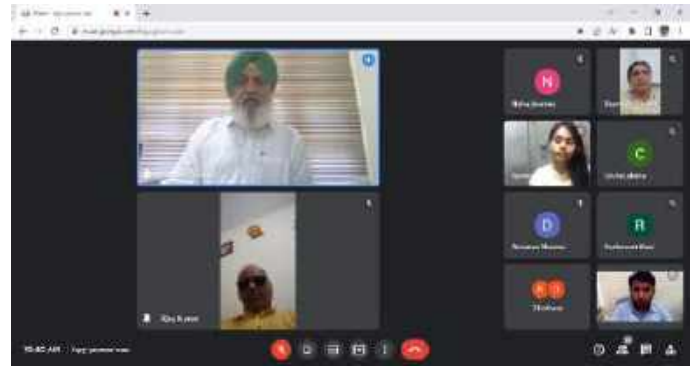
Partition Horror Remembrance Day (14th Aug, 2022)

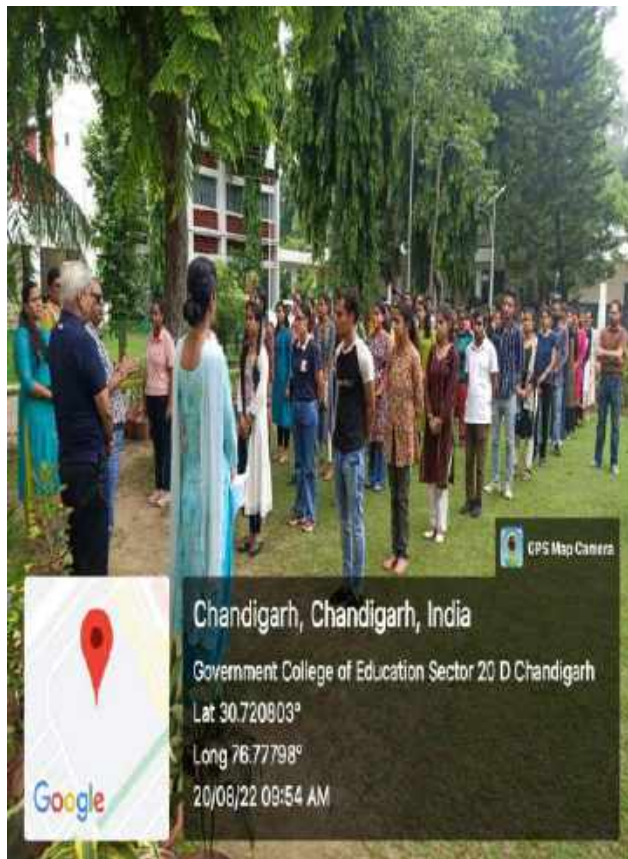




Sadhbhavana Diwas (20th Aug, 2022)

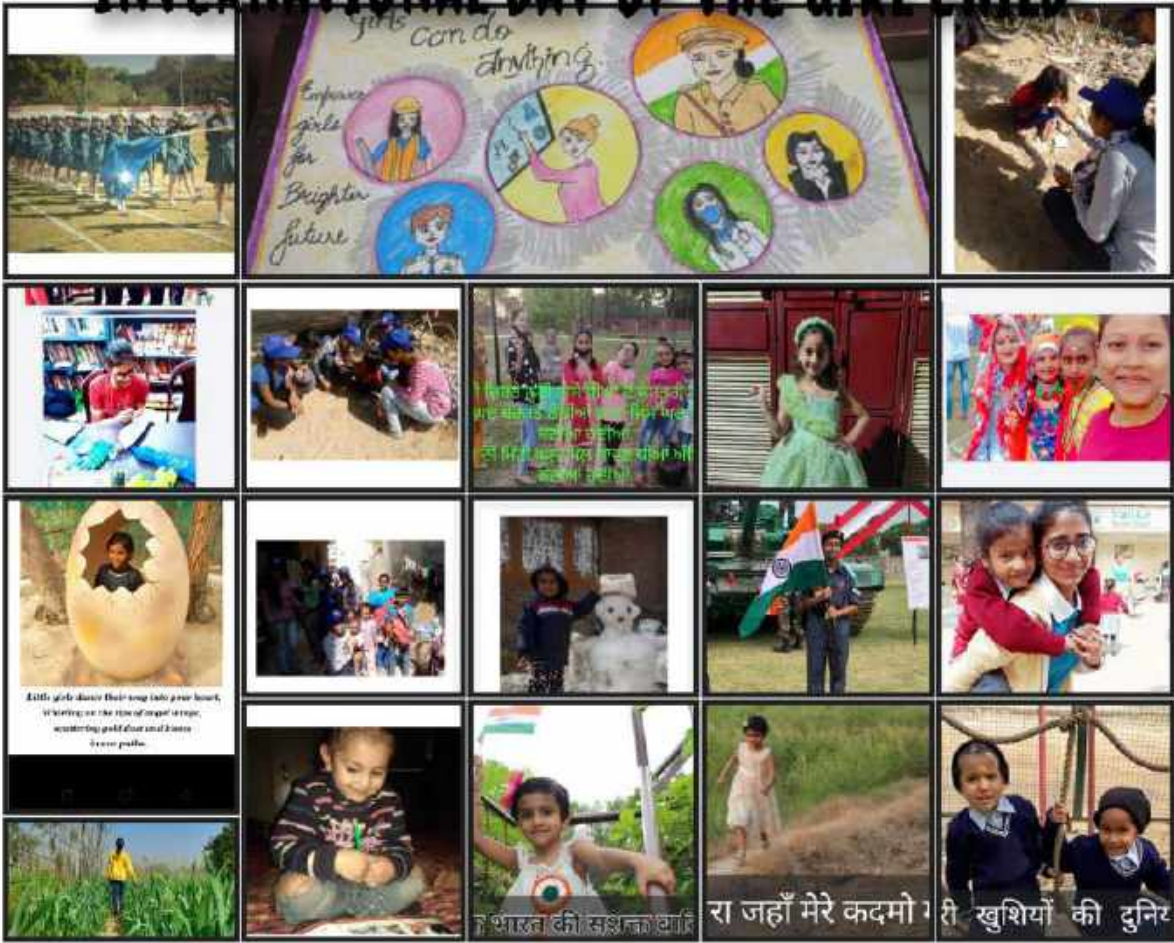


INTERNATIONAL GIRL CHILD DAY (11th Sep, 2022)

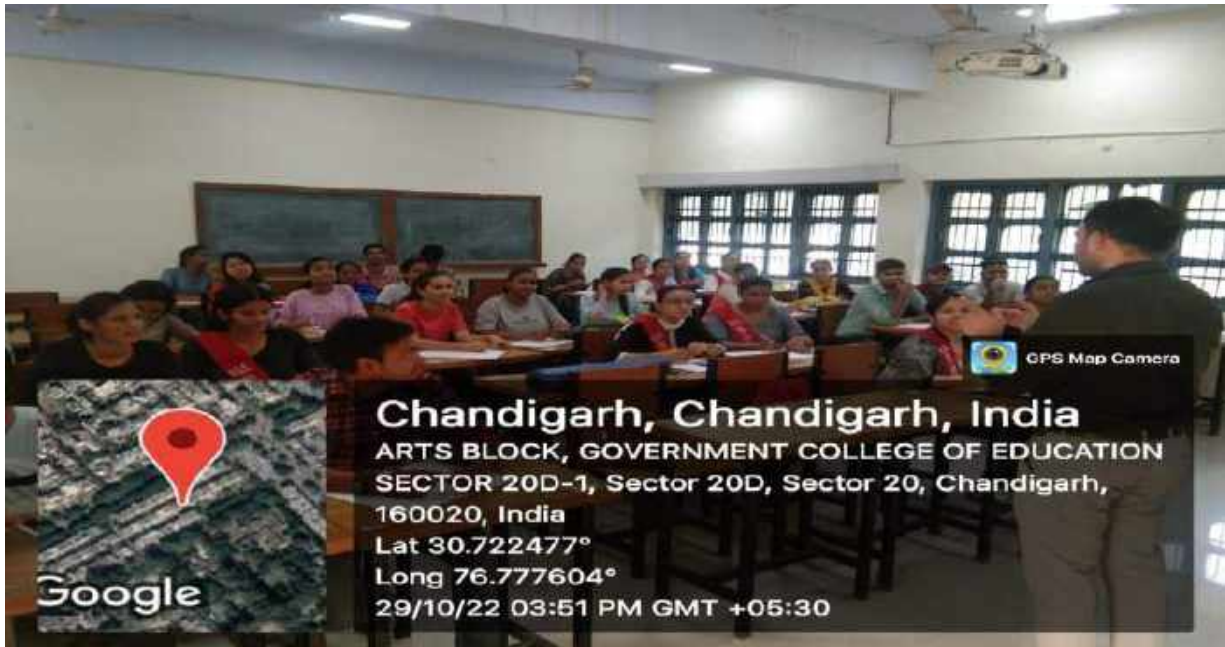

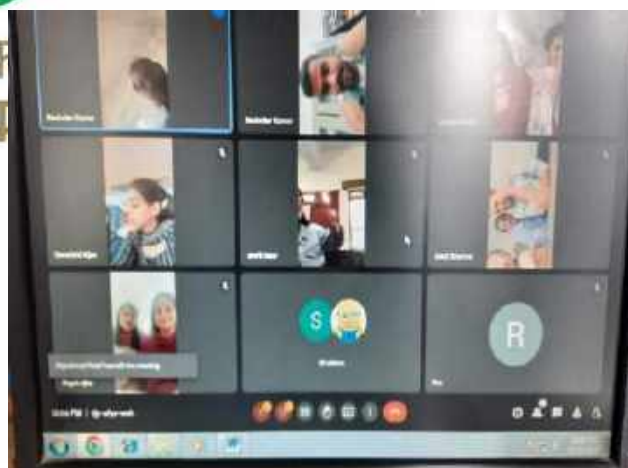


“Janjatiya Gaurav Divas” (November 15, 2022)

In the post session slogan writing and mask making competition was organized on the theme of World AIDS Day. The volunteers participated with full zeal and enthusiasm.

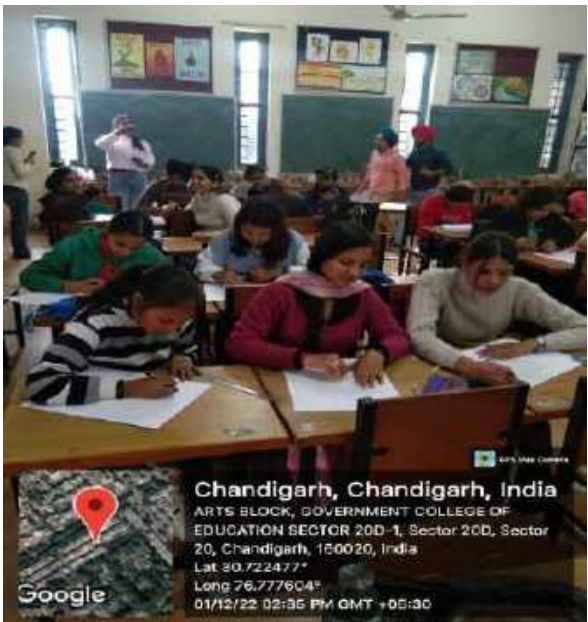

The Chandigarh unit reached the venue on 9th February 2023 and was registered on the same day. The Volunteers were given their Ids and Camp Diaries.

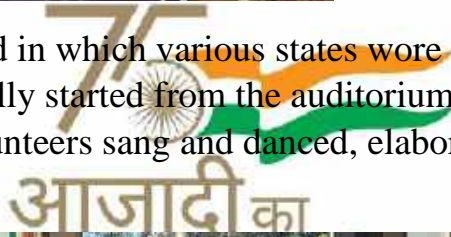
First Day (10.02.2023)

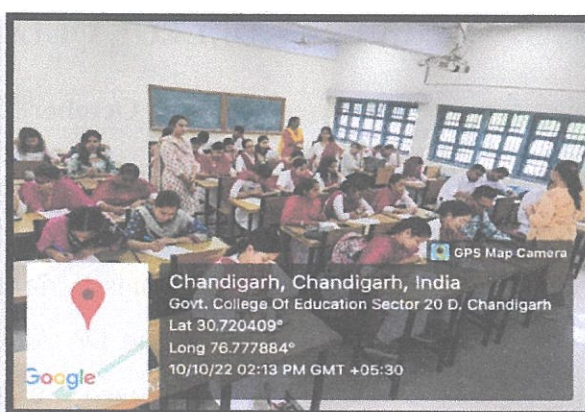
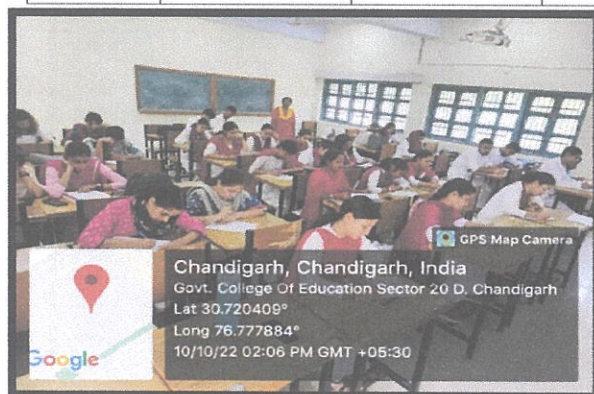
INTRA COLLEGE QUIZ COMPETITION

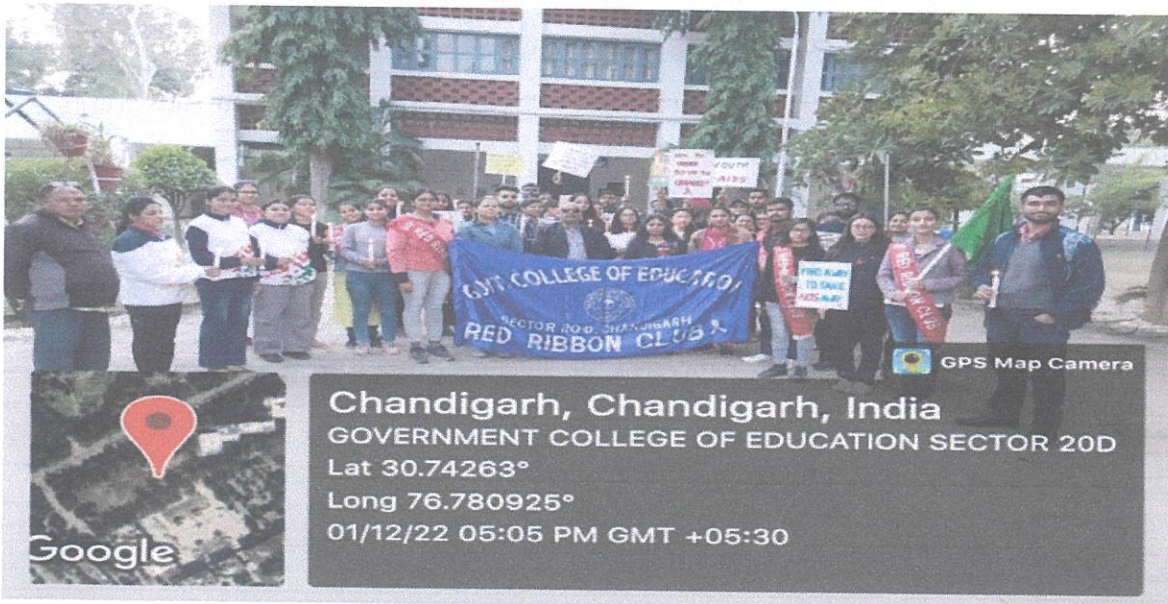




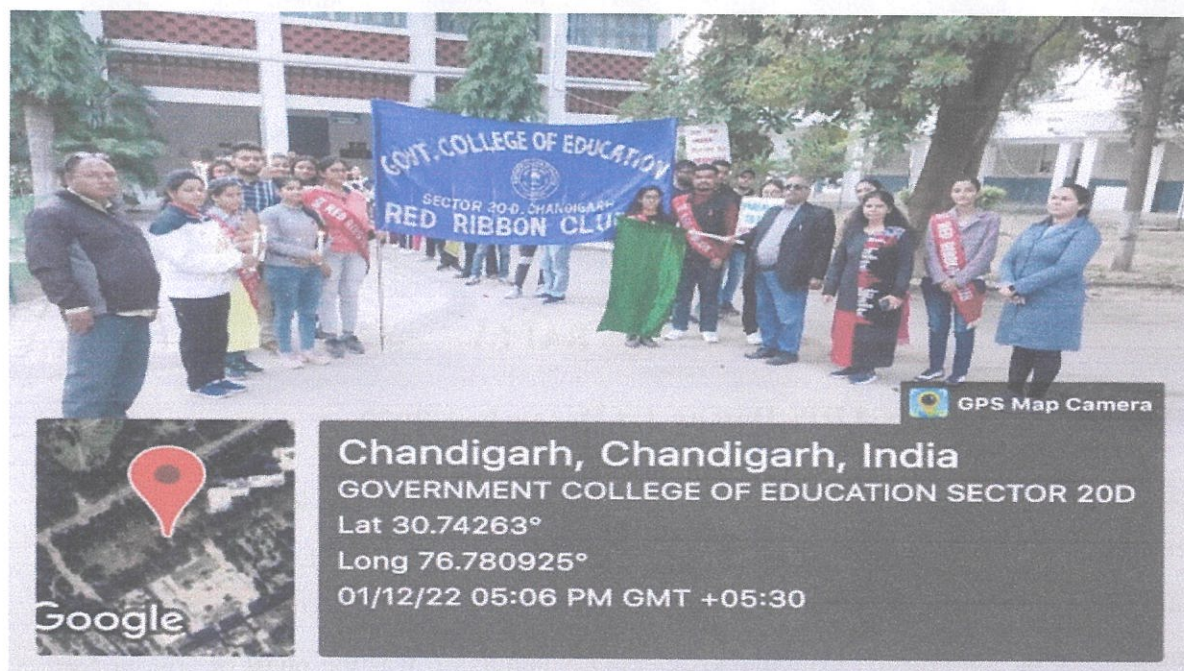
AIDS AWARENESS RALLY

World's AIDS Day on 1st December, 2022

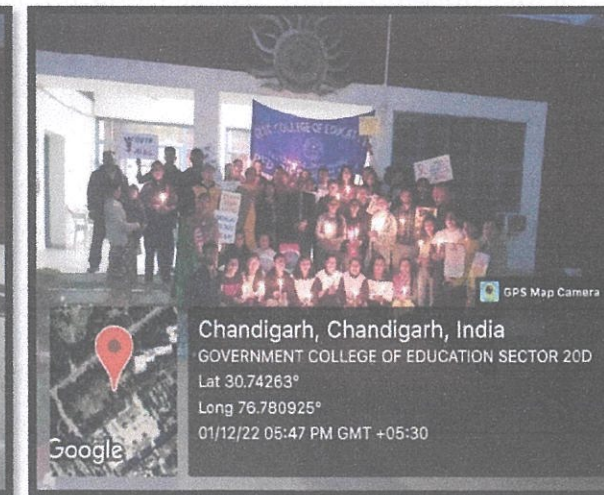
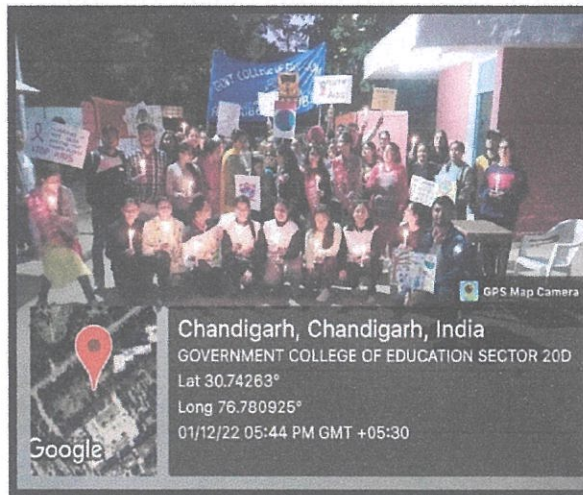
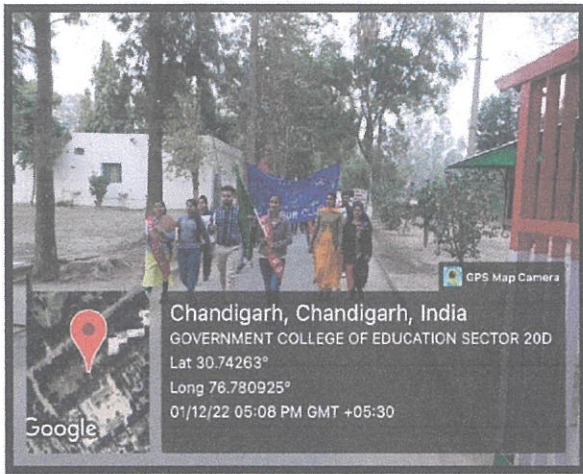

BLOOD DONATION CAMP

Date: 10 March 2023

One day blood donation camp was organized by the Red Ribbon Club of the Government College of Education; sector 20 D, Chandigarh on 10th March 2023 under the esteemed guidance of our club Incharge Dr. Kusum and member Dr. Aarti Bhatt. Dr. Jaswinder Kaur Director, Government Medical College of Hospital, Sector 32 was the Chief Guest on the occasion and she inaugurated the camp along with Dr. Ravneet Kaur Head, Department of Blood Transfusion, Government Medical College of Hospital, Sector 32, Dr. (Mrs.) Sapna Nanda, Principal, Government College of Education, Dr. A.K. Srivastava (Dean GCE20) and RRC incharge Dr. Kusum and member RRC Dr. Aarti Bhatt. The session started with motivational lecture by Dr. Ravneet Kaur from Government Medical College of Hospital, Sector 32 where she highlighted the importance of blood donation. She discussed about the need of blood to save human life, components of blood that can be used, the situations and diseases where blood transfusion is required. She continued her discussion with the importance of voluntary blood donation and why blood given voluntarily is the best type of blood donation that a person can do. She also emphasised on the fact that blood is replenishable and there is no major effect on donator health whatsoever. After this, she gave a detailed description about the process of blood donation where she described the whole process of selecting those donors that are healthy and able to give blood which comes with certain conditions(like having haemoglobin more than 12.5, not being on any medication, not being on periods for females, etc.). After this selection, the donor is asked to lie down and the blood is taken under careful observation of the doctors with clear labelling and careful handling of the collected sample. After the blood has been taken, the donor is monitored by the onsite doctors for a little while so that they can make sure that the donor is in perfect health. Dr. Ravneet Kaur motivated everyone present in the hall to donate blood and save lives, and the result was that the students of the college enthusiastically participated in the blood donation camp. All volunteers were awarded with a brooch and a certificate by Madam Principal, Dr Ravneet Kaur and Dr. Kusum. Students of both semesters took part in blood donation camp enthusiastically along with teaching and non-teaching staff. Refreshment was also given to donators. Team of 10 doctors were there to assist and guide donator. Students have to undergo through an examination which included checking weight and haemoglobin level of students to check whether they are fit for donating blood or not

Similarly, Sheron, a student of B.Ed Semester 4 was much appreciated for an expressive handmade poster and received the Consolation prize for Poster Presentation.



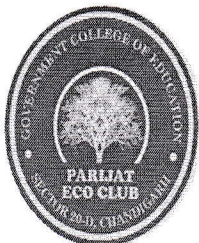

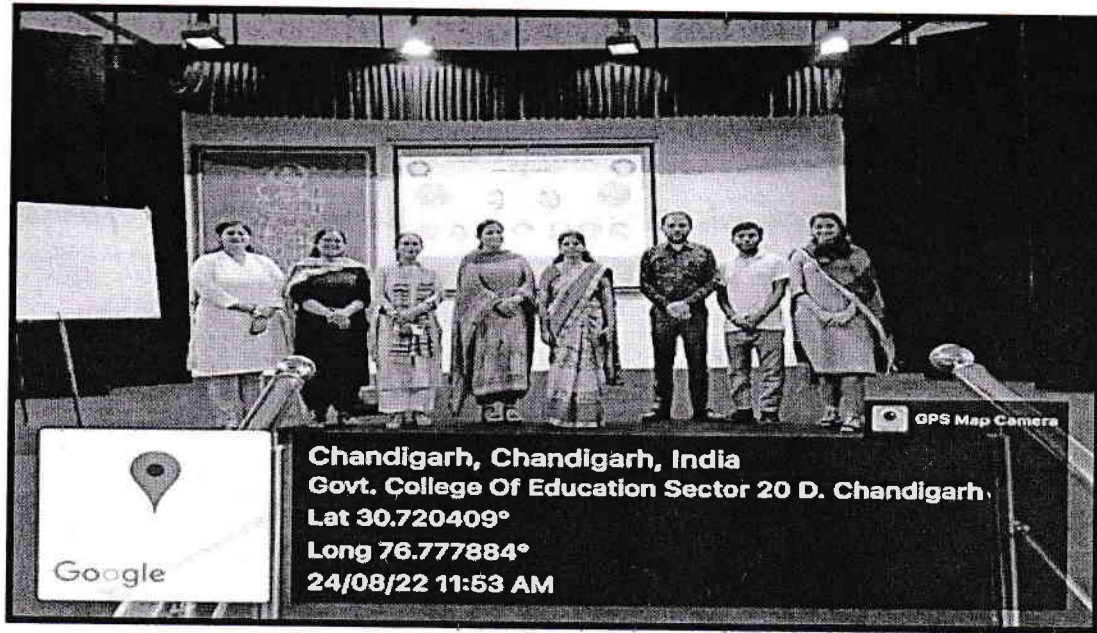
In the first session Dr. Rupinder Brar, Assistant Professor, Shivalik Institute of Education and Research, Mohali made students understand the use of

What are co-curricular activities?

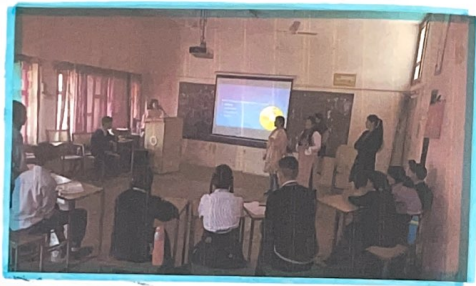

SCIENCE QUIZ

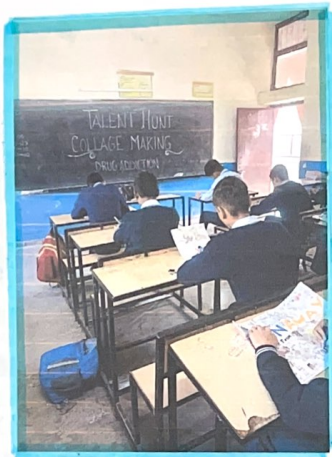

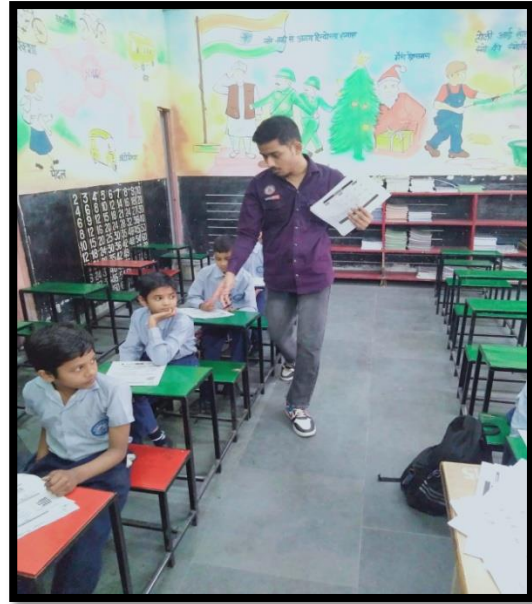
GOVERNMENT COLLEGE OF EDUCATION, CHANDIGARH REPORT

BASELINE ASSESSMENT FROM GRADE 3RD TO 5TH IN ALL GOVT. SCHOOLS UT, CHANDIGARH

Baseline Assessment Exam was conducted by Skill-in-Teaching Committee in the College according to as per the instructions of the District Education Officer Ms. Bindu in collaboration with NGO Arpan Kachi Sadak to assess the basic literacy skills of students of class 3rd, 4th and 5th in Government Schools of Chandigarh. B.Ed 2nd Semester students were appointed as invigilators to ensure the smooth functioning of the assessment. A training session was conducted for the student invigilators in college premises on April 20th, 2023 in the presence of DEO Ms. Bindu, along with resource persons Mr. Ravinder, Ms. Rupinder Kaur and Ms. Neha from Kachi Sadak NGO. Detailed guidelines were given to the invigilators regarding conduction and evaluation of the assessment. After that students continued with their Internship program Phase-II of B. Ed. 2nd semester till April 27th, 2023.

From April 28th, 2023 to May 04th, 2023; 107 Students of B.Ed 2nd semester performed their duty as invigilators in 67 Government Schools of Chandigarh for classes 3rd, 4th and 5th during morning and evening shifts. Exam was conducted in two parts at a time. First part was the written test of English, Hindi and Mathematics, second part was the oral reading assessment of the same before mentioned subjects. After conducting test, it was checked by the invigilators immediately and levels were assigned to each student for each subject in order to depict the level of students learning. After evaluation, levels were uploaded on the provided google sheet. Student invigilator got an opportunity to interact with students at ground level and gained valuable experience.

INSTITUTE FOR THE BLIND

INTRODUCTION

EVER since its formation in 1972, the Society for the Care of the Blind, Sector 26, Chandigarh (Regd.) has been actively engaged in the education, training and rehabilitation of blind children and also working for the prevention of blindness.

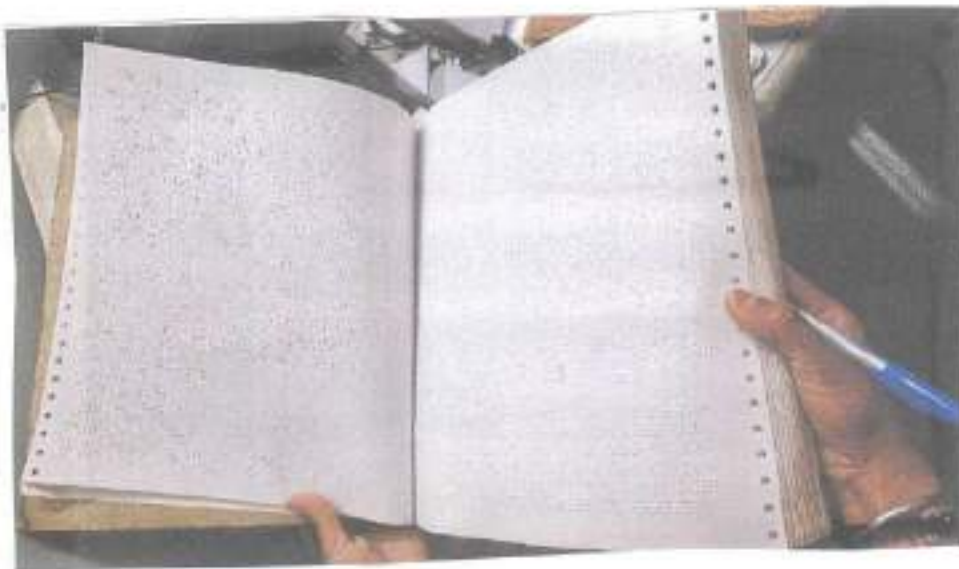
OBJECTIVES OF INSTITUTE

- To impart educational and vocational training to the blind children.
- To help in the rehabilitation of children passing out of the institute.
- To create awareness among the general public, particularly the rural areas in and around Chandigarh, on the causes of blindness and promote its prevention.



VISION OF THE INSTITUTE

The institute nurtures an ideal mission to integrate the visually impaired into the mainstream of social life. It involves parents/ professionals and persons with missionary spirit to contribute their best to help them in their rehabilitation. All at the helm of affairs make earnest endeavour to provide these children the opportunities needed for self-reliance and all-round development of their personality. The Institute also aims to inspire and inculcate in them the zeal and zest for comparative quality of life through their full participation and ensuring equal opportunities.



SERVICES OF THE INSTITUTE

EDUCATION

It is a senior secondary school, and the instruction is mainly imparted through Braille script. Matric and Senior Secondary examination are conducted by CBSE Board. The institute has been maintaining excellent academic records.

ADMISSIONS

At present, the institute have a total of 153 students. Admissions are open to both boys and girls without any discrimination of caste, creed, region, religion etc. provided the child is visually impaired and is certified by the Eye Department Govt. Hospital Sector 16 Chandigarh that the child is mentally sound and is having no communicable disease.



DONATIONS

The donations can be made both in cash or kind. The Donations are exempted 50% under section 80G of Income Tax Act. The society for the cause of the blind has not authorized any individual/organization to collect donations on its behalf. Donors are requested not to entertain anyone claiming to be our representative for seeking donations.

STAFF

At present the number of teachers including vocational staff is 19. out of them 18 members (aided staff) are covered under 95% grant-in-aid scheme and the rest of the members are paid out of the funds of the society. As mentioned



alone the aided staff is getting salary as per their counterparts in govt. service. The staff paid by the society is being paid less but they have been covered under the facility the E.P.F. scheme. Aided staff comprising 45 members includes office superintendent, warden, clerks, computer operator, accountant, dormitory attendants, cooks, Durwans, safai kamacharis, Ays, Choutidars etc.

HOSTEL FACILITY

Hostel facility is available for 70 boys and 60 girls. They have separate hostels with suitable facilities of toilets, solar water heating arrangements, TV and indoor games etc.

ACADEMIC RESULTS

The Institute was earlier affiliated to Punjab School Education Board Mohali but since academic year 2014-15 it has been affiliated to Central Board of School Education (CBSE) New Delhi.

The Institute has an excellent record of academic achievements. It is heartening to state that during the last two decades the institute has shown excellent results by cent percent students getting first division. Some of the students have been placed in merit lists.

SPORTS ACHIEVEMENTS

Indian Blind Sports Association, New Delhi organised 21st National Athletic Championship for the blind from 10th to 13th December, 2018.

at Thyaguaj sport complex, New Delhi. 17 athletes of our institute participated and brought laurels to the city beautiful as well as glory for the institute. They bagged 20 medals out of which seven gold, five silver and eight are bronze medals and also quailed two Championship trophies. This remarkable performance was widely covered by media to motivate and inspire others.

It is worthwhile to mention here that for the first time workshop known as Goal-ball was organised in Delhi in which athletes exhibited remarkable performance.

SCHOOL BAND

The school band participated in the Republic Day parade on 26th January 2019 at Parade ground, Chandigarh. They marched with martial enthusiasm and were accompanied with third position.



EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

The students take active part in the Co-curricular activities like Annual cultural functions celebrated in the institute and music competitions, paper-reading competitions organised by other institutions/ organisations and by the Education Department at the state level.

BRAILLE PRODUCTION UNIT

Braille Press is a very special unit of the 'Society for the Care of the Blind', Chandigarh. Being reading and writing are two most vital aspects of education for the blind as well as other students. The society made a humble beginning in early 90's by introducing a small scale Braille Production unit.

At that time the books were prepared manually on Braille by fully trained experts.

With each passing day, the press showed greater levels of efficiency and production and is producing

Braille literature in variety of languages viz. Hindi, Punjabi, English and Haryanvi etc. Besides text

books, story books and other general books are also produced

here. The Chandigarh Transport Undertaking (CTU) introduced

guide map and route of their buses for the visually impaired persons in Braille script which was embossed in Braille press.

Chandigarh Art Gallery & Museum was also helped by embossing

the name and description of each sculpture, murals, arts, painting etc in Braille script. As and

when required, the services of experts are also made

available to the needy organizations for the cause of blindness.



Religious and books for social cause like Nitnem and Dukh Bhairini Sahit (in Gurmukhi), Aartis/ Bhajans (Devnagri) and Right to Information Act (Punjabi and English) etc. were also taken up. The Braille press prints text books of all subjects - including science and social studies up to Class XII.

For over 10 years during General Elections the state of Punjab, Haryana & U.T. Chandigarh are assigning the job of printing Ballot Papers in Braille for the visually handicapped voters in their states to Braille press.

About 10 years back, the Braille Production unit was initiated by installing a high speed index & wand Braille Embosser and has been expanded to two big rooms. Today the press has

Three index Braille Embosser and it has emerged as one of



the unique Braille Press in the northern region under the able guidance and dedication of Shri Vishwanjit who is running this press since 1997. Shri Pankaj Sharma also joined the organization in 2007 and helps him to accomplish this task since then. The books embossed at the Braille Press are made available to the visually challenged students free of any charge, which is noteworthy.

LIBRARY

A well stocked library exists in the institute. It contains books both in Braille script and in ink-prints. Every now and then it is kept enriched with new arrivals of monthly and fortnightly magazines, journals and newsletters of educational value. This facility is utilized by the students and staff members especially to update their knowledge.



RESOURCE ROOM

A resource room is where students spend some time to get academic or other assistance from special education teachers,

students with disabilities including visual impairments who are placed in a resource room and have an opportunity to study in small groups with special education teachers.

These teachers help the students to improve their areas of weakness in resource rooms.

CURRICULUM ADAPTATION OF LEARNING DISABILITY

Adapting the curriculum involves modifying the context, instructional strategies, and the different ways of assessing what the learner has learned. Viewed in this manner, providing curriculum adaptation is a way in which to implement Howard Gardner's theory of multiple intelligences. "There is no one best way to educate all children. Indeed, the biggest mistake of past experience centuries has been to treat all children as if they were variants of the same individual and thus to feel justified in teaching them the same subjects in the same way."

Teachers, researchers, parents and even students frequently express that students with disabilities have limited exposure to the general-education curriculum or that the curriculum is minimized to the point that students are inhibited in their opportunity to learn. At the elementary-student level, students with special learning needs frequently can fully participate in regular classroom instruction using adaptations of simplified or supplemented existing materials. The goal is not to reduce content for students with special learning needs, but to provide tools for them to access content in the fullest sense. Simplifying existing materials can take many forms:

- Reuniting instructional materials in a simplified format
- Providing summaries, graphic organizers, or outlines of instructional materials.

- Developing study guide to provide support before, during and after reading.
- Shortening reading or math assignments.
- Adjusting the pacing of assignment to allow for re-readings.
- Colour coding textbooks to highlight key concepts and new vocabulary.
- Audio taping textbook contents

Supplementing existing materials include the use of alternative materials to help students master the same content or skills presented in the general curricular materials. Such adaptations include using:
Direct experiences; films or videotapes, computer software.

Simplifying or supplementing existing materials can be consuming for teachers. Teachers who plan in advance for such adaptations frequently engage

parent volunteers or for professionals in adapting material. Students of all achievement grouping appreciate teachers who make adaptations for students who need them, and most students prefer using materials that are identical to those used by their same age peers. Planning can help a busy teacher create materials that will make these types of adaptations routine and provide a bank of resources to draw upon for future classes.

EFFECTIVE CURRICULUM ADAPTATIONS

ARE BASED ON:

→ Adapting Instructional Strategies:

This refers to the way to teacher teaches, the methodologies the teacher

uses to provide information to learners in the class. Adapting the instructional process can be made possible through numerous techniques like:

- use of demonstrations or role play.
- utilizing teacher presentation aids (eg. visual or verbal) to emphasize key points and key concepts to be learned.
- Getting learners more actively involved in the learning process through the implementation of every pupil response techniques (eg. response cards, thumbs up, thumbs down)
- Diversifying the selection of grouping for instruction so as not to rely on large group/whole class instructions and independent seat arrangements
- Including a variety of small group and cooperative learning activities, is another

effective manner by which to adapt classroom instructions.

- Providing learners with curriculum context through adaptation of traditional reading will involve a peer or an adult reading aloud to a learner.

A number of other possibilities also exist

- Multisensory Approaches
- Whole world approach to teaching reading
- Related instructions and/or reading
- Language experience approach
- Concrete materials and manipulatives
- Hands on experience
- Repeat / rephrase directions
- Braille
- Recorded books
- Self-checking materials
- Programmed materials
- High interest / low vocabulary reading.

→ Adapting Instructional materials

This involves making changes to the equipment and/or supplies to which learners have access during the course of instruction.

This involves a change in the formats through which information is represented to the learner with the curriculum during the course of instruction. The process of adapting materials provides additional or simply different materials, in a variety of modalities that the learners might use during the course of instruction. Most materials adaptations fall into one of four groups:

- Adapting the readability level of written materials →

By providing content similar to one unit currently under study through a learner grade

level reading book, compressed text, or high interest-vocabulary reader. In addition, to reading demand is adjusted when curriculum content is depicted through audio tapes, video tapes, internet based resources, text reader software programs or universally designed textbooks and materials.

- Enhancing critical features of the content within the materials themselves?

Involves adapting lesson materials in such a way as to identify for the learner context that is most essential. Advance or post-organisers, large print display, presentation of new vocabulary words in boldface, highlighting difficult levels in a reading and summaries of main ideas represent a few commonly used adaptations.

• Designing materials with features that appeal to sensory modalities other than visual / auditory:

for example, learners physically walking a route of colored tape on the floor to learn the path of blood flow from the heart (as opposed to studying a colored diagram) or wapping with hands gestures as they learn newly language concepts.

• selecting alternate instructional materials for their durability or safety features in consideration of a learner's physical coordination or motor skills. In the science lab, a plastic beaker or petri dish might be utilized instead of their breakable counter parts, or a learner might be provided with

A soft book, or book with laminated pages, instead of traditional text.

→ Adapting assessment practices:-

This refers to alterations in the way in which a teacher gets information from learners in her class. The adaptation of assessment practices is not limited only to the expansion of test-taking parameters (e.g. redistributed time on a paper test, use of a recorder for recording purposes).

This class of curricular adaptations also encompasses using multiple criteria to assess learners' products, providing structured answer forms on worksheets and tests, evaluating processes equally with final products, comparing a learner's performance to her own

past performances, and offering learners a variety of practical strategies and choices for producing required assignments.

- offering learners the opportunity to respond to instruction in a non-traditional manner, in some way(s) other than through typical oral recitation or written expressions, is also exam passed in this final curriculum adaptation category.
- Alternative learner responses might include: collage, pantomime, dramatic portrayal, musical composition, motoric demonstration, photographic presentation, or graphics display.

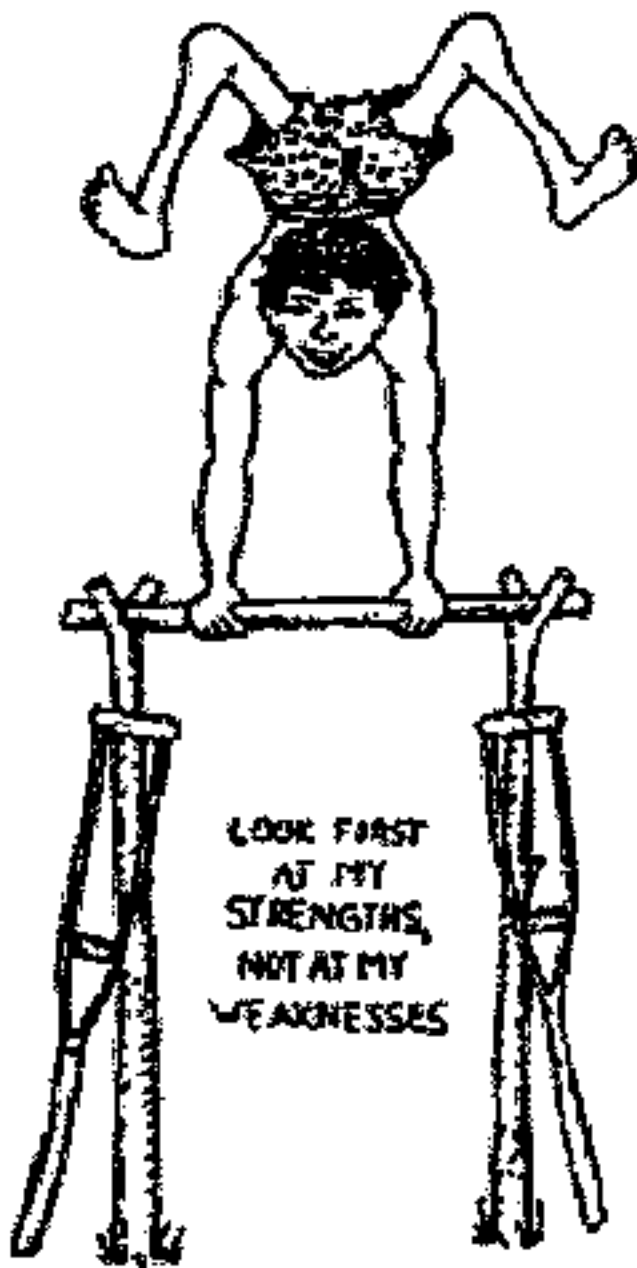

curricular adaptations allow learners to use their current skill range and participate, at least partially, in a general education. Instructional activity, while promoting the acquisition of new skills.

→ Adapting Curricular Context →

This type of curriculum adaptation results in an adjustment of the cognitive demand of learning to the level of learners. Adapting curricular content might involve applications as straight forward as:

- Reducing the number of vocabulary words assigned to an individual child.
- Having a learner complete only the odd numbered problems on a mathematics assignment.



- Holding a learner responsible for learning three facts about one animal, instead of two facts about each other of five different species or, giving learners the choice of taking a spelling pretest to opt out of spelling for particular week.

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

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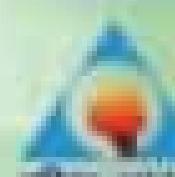
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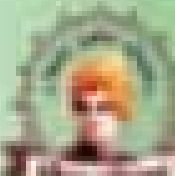

“IMPROVING COMMUNICATION SKILLS: Some Suggestions for an Effective Interview”

(4th November, 2022)

The Government College of Education, Sector 20D, Chandigarh organized a lecture **under the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)** signed with the Regional Institute of English, Sector 32, Chandigarh on the theme- **“Improving Communication Skills: Some Suggestions for an Effective Interview”** in the Society Period on **4th November, 2022** from 12:00 noon to 1:20 p.m. for the **B.Ed., M.Ed. and PGDG&C** students of the college. The Resource Person for the event was Dr. Gopal Chandra Nayak, Assistant Professor, Regional Institute of English, Sector-32, Chandigarh. Principal of the college, Dr. A.K. Srivastava formally welcomed the resource person of the day. A brief introduction of the guest was given to students by Dr. Sheojee Singh and Dr. Anjali Puri, Associate Professors, Government College of Education, Sector 20, Chandigarh.

In his address to students Dr. Gopal Ji discussed about the varied types of communication- verbal, non-verbal, listening, visual, signs etc. He also talked about how important our body language (65%) is over our spoken words (7%) and actions (28%), which justifies the proverb “Actions speak louder than words”. He emphasized that communication is not just the sounds produced but a language that is used not only in terms of grammatical sense but it should be meaningful in the context with proper gestures, feelings and emotions. Also, barriers we have to keep in mind for an effective communication were discussed. He focused on simple but effective tools that can make our communication effective as sticking to the objective, being sincere, brief and precise, relaxed, empathetic, giving and receiving feedback, being visual and being respectful towards others in communication.

Further, he laid emphasis on being an active listener so as to fully understand before responding. Being active listeners we must also learn to, “talk less, listen more”. We must read more closely, the emotional side of the speaker and be mindful about our own words

because as it is rightly said, "Be careful with your words. Once they are said, they can be only forgiven, not forgotten.

In addition, he also presented interview skills in a broader perspective including the types of interviews, formal introduction, formal dressing etc. Also, the positive effect of an enthusiastic voice during a telephonic interview was also discussed about. Great emphasis was laid on some game changing kind words like PLEASE and THANK YOU. He also highlighted that, how a beaming smile could have a positive effect on the interviewer. He motivated the students to face the fears like anxiety and nervousness by preparing well, in advance, extensive reading and research, or even attending a mock interview.

At the end, a question answer session was held wherein students asked their queries and discussed their experiences after his motivating talk.

The program concluded with a formal vote of thanks extended by Dr. Rajni Thakur, Coordinator for the event, towards the resource person, the worthy principal, IQAC committee, the faculty members and the participating students for all the cooperation and support to make the event a success.

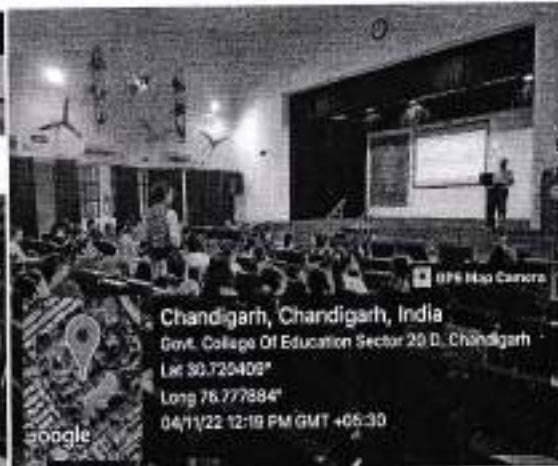



The workshop was divided into three different sessions. The **first session** was Teaching of Grammar by Dr. Gopal Chandra Nayak. He introduced the topic of teaching grammar in an interactive way. The session was activity based where students emerged themselves in group work, discussions and critical thinking. He talked about importance of teaching grammar in a contextual manner instead of isolated teaching. Different methods of teaching grammar were discussed in detail with clarity.



The **second session** was on Textbook Analysis and Discourse by Dr. Vandana Lunyal. She elaborately discussed how textbooks can be analyzed and utilized by the teachers effectively to enhance learning in a holistic way. She talked about influence of culture, gender biasedness and various stereotypes present in school textbooks. Dr. Vandana emphasized on the role of teachers to eliminate such stereotypes while teaching.

The **third session** was on Teaching of poetry by Dr. Jyoti Singh. She talked about various Levels of Stylistic Analysis and how it is used in poetry. This session was very interesting as students were involved in analyzing two different poems. Different aspects of poetry were covered in this interactive session.

After all the three sessions and lunch break, Valedictory session was initiated with the presence of Dr. A.K.Srivastava, Principal, Government College of Education Sector-20D, Chandigarh. Dr. A.K.Srivastava addressed the students and encouraged them to learn and explore further. Students shared their overall experience and certificates were provided to all the students for participating in the workshop.



The workshop ended on a very positive note by signing of an MoU between the Regional Institute of English and Government College of Education.



The main objective of this workshop was to enhance the knowledge of the students and familiarize them with innovative ways of teaching English. Such workshops are quite crucial for wide exposure and also to expand the knowledge of the students. This workshop was really helpful in giving students an opportunity to understand and learn directly from the experts working in the field of teaching and training.

Government College of Education sector-20 Chandigarh has taken an initiative to conduct a Workshop on "Teaching of English" for quality enhancement under the aegis of IQAC Cell of the College in collaboration with the Regional Institute of English. The students of Pedagogy of English visited the Regional Institute of English, sector-32 C for attending the workshop. It was organized by the expert faculty members; Dr. Vandana Lunyal, Dr. Jyoti Singh, Dr. Gopal Chandra Nayak at the Regional Institute of English.



About RIE

The Regional Institute of English (RIE) was established in 1963 by Government of India Act to address the educational needs of Chandigarh, Jammu & Kashmir, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Punjab and Ladakh. The functioning of the Institute is within the purview of the Chandigarh Administration.

The Institute worked and collaborated with state governments in the northern region, CBSE, Panjab University, NCERT, USIEF, British Council and RELO, American Centre, New Delhi for various research projects and teacher training programmes and the English and Foreign Languages University (EFL-U), Hyderabad.

RIE has been running many courses each with a different set of target group i.e. catering to English language needs of people at diverse levels. It runs MA English, Postgraduate Certificate in the Teaching of English (PGCTE), a 120-hour course in Personal Development for students of UT Administration colleges. One new department was introduced in the session 2016-17 called Department of Continuous Professional Development, with the objective of addressing diverse needs of English Language Teaching in schools and colleges.

In the year 2016 -17, another in-service course introduced for the teachers of English of Chandigarh Administration was introduced to train teachers for their continuous professional development. In this course, teachers stay affiliated to the institute for 8 months to improve their teaching skills through trying out in their schools what they learn at the institute and report their success/failure of the methodology internalized at the institute on their subsequent visit to RIE.

The institute has also ventured into the areas of Skill Development and Disaster Management since 2017. The faculty is engaged in constantly updating the curriculum of the courses to meet the changing needs of teacher- training and to provide teachers with specialized content relevant to professional and personal success in a rapidly changing world.

Session 1: Teaching Grammar Communicatively by Dr. Gopal Chandra Nayak

Dr. Gopal Chandra Nayak was the first speaker of the day. He started the topic in a very enthusiastic way which drew the attraction and attention of the audience. He taught various approaches and methods to teach the students how to learn grammar effectively. It started with an approach to compare the ongoing trend of teaching the grammar into school curriculum. He gave various exercises to the students in order to understand the principle behind the grammatical exercises. He made an enthusiastic effort to engage the audience in every possible way and he really gave insightful information of efficient teaching of grammar to the pupil teachers. He gave a lot of information about the step by step process of teaching grammar as well as how it could become an organic learning process so that it is not really boring for the students to learn grammar. It was a very informative session of one and a half hours.



Session 2 : Strategizing Teaching Vocabulary by Dr. Vandana Luniyal

Dr. Vandana Luniyal took the session on the topic strategizing teaching vocabulary. In this session she gave very insightful information about how a teacher should strategize his or her vocabulary teaching. She put an emphasis on teaching of difficult and new words in the class so that the students would be able to learn new words every day. She engaged the audience in a way that it became a very interactive session. She also pointed out the use of association or principle of association while teaching vocabulary. It relates to the principle that students would be able to learn when they would be able to associate with some certain incidents or experience. She also pointed out that there should be a proper technique to teach vocabulary to this students so that the teaching and the learning process would not become boring or monotonous in anyway.



Session 3: Poetry Teaching by Dr. Jyoti Singh

Dr. Jyothi Singh delivered her session on poetry teaching. She introduced a new form or a new way of analyzing a poem that is stylistic. Stylistic is a word which is made up of style + linguistic. She engaged the students in various activities like analyzing the poem in four forms

which are graphology, phonology, morphology and Lexico-Syntax. She gave a new way of analyzing and reading the poem. It was a very interactive as well as a very informative. The workshop was followed by certificates distribution.

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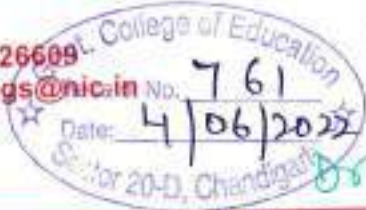

You are aware, the Ministry of Statistics & Programme Implementation (MOSPI) brings out periodically, macro-economic aggregates and indicators on the basis of data which emanate from administrative records or through Sample Surveys conducted for households, establishments, etc. The National Statistical Office (NSO), MOSPI is responsible for conducting such large scale sample surveys on different socio-economic aspects of the Indian society and covers diverse subjects like Consumer Expenditure, Health, Education, Employment and Unemployment, Agriculture etc. The Central and the State Governments use these data for development of the Nation with the help of planning, research, formulation and implementation of welfare policies thereby, leading to the betterment of society.

2. NSO has its various field offices spread across the country and its field officials visit households and establishments to collect data for these surveys. At present, Field Operations Division (FOD) under NSO consists of a network of 2 Headquarters, 6 Zonal Offices, 53 Regional Offices and 116 Sub-Regional Offices

3. The Regional Office, Chandigarh is headed by Deputy Director General, a Senior Administrative Grade Officer from the Indian Statistical Service (ISS) Cadre. He is assisted by a team of dedicated technical professionals from the Indian Statistical Service and Subordinate Statistical Service. The Regional Office with five Sub-regional Offices at Ambala, Karnal, Hisar, Rohtak and Faridabad facilitates data collection work in 23 districts of State of Haryana and UT of Chandigarh. Besides, the Regional Office is also entrusted with the task of liaison with State Authorities in matters related to conduct of all India Surveys from time to time. In order to accomplish the above activities, more than 200 personnel are working at RO Chandigarh and five SROs.
