

above and to state that the Chandigarh Administration has decided to  
allocate 60% seats for UT Pool and 40% seats for General Pool/Outside Pool  
in respect of B.Ed. College and Government Home Science College,  
Chandigarh in stead of 85% seats for UT Pool and 15% seats for General  
Pool/Outside Pool with effect from the forth coming session 2004-2005.

The other provisions in the existing policy shall remain  
unchanged.

Subject: Policy regarding reservation of seats in admission to educational/technical/medical institutions under the control of Chandigarh Administration.

Sir,

I am directed to address you on the subject noted above and to say that in order to bring uniformity in matters regarding admission in all the institutions under the control of Chandigarh Administration and also to clarify the policy more with regard to reservation of seats to remove any ambiguity while implementing the same and further with a view to making such policy handy and available at one place, it has been decided by the Chandigarh Administration to frame the policy for reservation in admissions afresh as under:-

- (1) Except Chandigarh Medical College, Chandigarh, where 85% seats are filled from amongst the students who pass their qualifying examination from the institutions situated in the Union Territory, Chandigarh and 15% seats are filled on All India basis, in other institutions 60% seats of the total sanctioned intake of the institution will be filled up from amongst the students who pass their qualifying examination from schools/Colleges recognised by Chandigarh Administration and situated in the Union Territory, Chandigarh, as a regular student of the said school/college subject to the condition that such students must have studied for two years at Chandigarh and have passed one lower qualifying examination from these schools/colleges. These seats will be termed as 'U.T. Pool'. The remaining 40% seats will be filled from amongst the students who pass their qualifying examination from the institutions other than those located in the Union Territory, Chandigarh or otherwise. These seats will be termed as 'General Pool'.

(2) Reservation in a pool for various categories of students in each pool shall be as under:-

(a) Reservation for Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribes

(i) Union Territory Pool

(a) Scheduled Castes	14%
(b) Scheduled Tribes	01%

General Pool	15%
(c) Scheduled Castes	5%
(d) Scheduled Tribes	

If the requisite number of students of Scheduled castes community in the Union Territory pool are not available, the seats will be thrown open to the students belonging to general category of the said pool. In general pool, if the requisite number of students belonging to S.C./S.T. community are not available, the reservation will be interchangeable amongst the students of these communities. However, if the seats still remain unfilled from the students belonging to these communities, these will be thrown open amongst the students belonging to the general category of the said pool.

The students belonging to these communities shall be allowed a concession of 5% marks for admission to the course in which a certain percentage of minimum marks has been prescribed, if permitted by the rules/regulations of the University/Board, to which the institution is affiliated.

(b) Reservation for dependants of Defence/para-military personnel etc.

Five percent seats in each pool would be filled from the following categories of students, in order of preference:-

- 1) Sons/daughters/spouses of defence personnel who are awardees of gallantry decorations of paramvir/Mahavir/Vir Chakra in person or posthumously, or
- Sons/daughters/spouses of defence personnel and para-military personnel like CRPF, BSF etc. who are killed or are totally incapacitated in action while in service and were wholly dependant on them.

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5.2 A candidate must secure a minimum of 10% marks in the B.Ed. Entrance Examination to qualify for the admission. However, the candidates belonging to SC/ST shall be eligible even if they secure 30% marks. i.e. 75 marks.

IMPORTANT NOTES

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- a) 3) 50 per cent of the total number of seats in the colleges of Education shall be reserved for candidates who have done graduation with these Science subjects i.e. Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Botany or Zoology or Biology, Geography, Computer Science, Electronics or B.Sc. (Agriculture), B.Sc. (Home Science), B.Sc. (Food Technology), Bachelor of Computer Application, B.Sc. (Computer Science).
- ii) in case the required number of candidates with above subjects do not turn up for admission or do not qualify in the Entrance Examination, seats left vacant shall be filled up from amongst candidates who have graduated with other subjects.
- b) Seats left vacant in any reserved category owing to non-availability of eligible candidates may be filled in from the eligible candidates belonging to respective general category.
- c) Candidates securing equal marks will be bracketed together. The inter-se merit for admission will be decided on following criteria in order of preference :-
  - i) Candidate with higher percentage of marks in Master's degree;
  - ii) Candidate with higher percentage of marks in qualifying Examination;
  - iii) Candidate older in age.

6. ADMISSION COMMITTEE

6.1 For selecting candidates for admission to B.Ed. course, each college shall have an Admission Committee consisting of the following :-

- a) Principal of the College (Chairman)
- b) Three members of the teaching faculty ordinarily representing faculties of Science, Social Sciences and Humanities, and languages (at least one of them shall be a woman in case of a co-educational institution).
- c) A nominee of the Punjab Govt./U.T. Administration, Chandigarh as the case may be (in case of Non-Govt. Colleges of Education only), and
- d) A nominee of the Vice-Chancellor.

GENERAL (D)

- 1 a) Graduation of certificates of Sports is necessary. There being no Director, Sports in Rajasthan University, Jaipur, may be accepted only after it was countersigned by the Director, Sports, Punjab. The admissions be made against the reserved seats of sportsmen categories in the order of graduation of sports achievements i.e. A, B, C, D in the very order on the basis of merit of the Entrance Test grade-wise.
  - b) Sports achievements at the School level will not be accepted.
  - c) For specific competent authority in case of reserved categories see Appendix 'A'.
  - d) The Verification of certificates in the case of SC/ST candidates will be made within a month after the admissions.
- 7.2 If any student does not attend the College within a week of the opening day, as announced by the college, his/her admission will stand cancelled.
- 7.3 The application forms of all the applicants should be arranged in order of merit of the Entrance Test for each category by the Admission Committee.
- 7.4 The signatures of every candidate should be taken date-wise at the time of the interview.
- 7.5 The selected candidates shall deposit the fee on the spot/ date/dates fixed by the Admission Committee. However, the candidates be given 24 hours to deposit their fee after the selection list has been put up on the Notice Board. The candidates on the waiting will be asked to report between 10.00 a.m. to 2.00 p.m. on the stipulated dates for depositing the fees against the seats available.
- 7.6 The attested copies of the certificates attached with the application form may be got signed by the candidates at the time of interview.
- 7.7 The candidate who fails to deposit his/her fees and thus misses his/her chance for admission will have no claim for admission on subsequent dates.
- 7.8 Category-wise selected and waiting lists shall be prepared and displayed on the Notice Board simultaneously. No supplementary admission will be made except on the date/s fixed for this purpose. The admissions will be made only out of the waiting lists prepared by the Admission Committee. The admission with late fee with the approval of the Vice-Chancellor will also be made on merit basis. Applications for such purpose will only be considered by the University if these are routed through the Principal of the College concerned.

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handicap/disability is such as will hinder or not pursuit of studies in the courses in which he/she is seeking admission, he/she should appear before the Principal Medical Officer, General Hospital, Sector 16, Chandigarh to get the doubt cleared. e) If the requisite number of students belonging to the category of defence/paramilitary personnel, physically handicapped, freedom fighters are not available, the seats will be thrown open to the students of general category of the said pool.

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Guidelines for admission to the  
general category of sports.

The percentage of total number of seats in each course shall be filled up with reservation/quotas. These two percent seats shall be reserved in each branch of sports and non-engineering courses in the institutions on the basis of total intake of each branch and the fraction of 0.25 or above shall be rounded off to the next higher number. This category shall not be divided into U.C. pool/general pool. The inter-se merit of the candidates seeking admission in any course in the reserved category of sports shall be determined only on the basis of their merits in sports as per grading criteria mentioned in the succeeding paragraphs. In case any of the seats in the sports category in any of the branches remains unfilled, the same shall be thrown open to the candidates belonging to general category.

Benefit of reservation under this category shall be available only to the following category of students:-

- (a) Who pass their qualifying examination from schools/colleges, recognized by Chandigarh Administration and situated in the Union Territory of Chandigarh, as a regular students of the said school/college, subject to the condition that such students must have studied for two years at Chandigarh and have passed one lower qualifying examination from those schools/colleges.
- (b) Students of other States/UTs, who have allowed the benefit of reservation in admissions in sports category to the residents of Union Territory, Chandigarh.

Performance in the following sports disciplines only shall be considered for the purpose of admission against this category, provided that the association/federation holding the tournament should be affiliated/recognized by the All India Federation of the concerned sport:-

4. Students seeking admission to this category should be of the following categories:-

- (i) If his/her achievement in sports related activity in any of the three years previous year of admission. (For example, for admission for the year 1993-94, the achievements shall pertain to the 1st April, 1993).
- (ii) If his/her age falls within the age group eligible for participation in Inter-College/University tournaments.

5. The sports graduation certificates shall be in the following descending order of merit:-

GRADE 'A'

Sportsmen/women of international standing who have represented India in the following International tournaments/Tests/Competitions/Championships etc.:-

- (i) Olympic Games.
- (ii) Commonwealth Games.
- (iii) Asian Games.
- (iv) Test Matches/One day matches in Cricket.
- (v) Davis Cup in Tennis.
- (vi) World Cup tournaments in respective games.

GRADE 'B'

Sportsmen/women who have participated in the following positions in the following international competitions/championships etc. as the winners:-

- (i) World University Games.
- (ii) Asian Federation Cup/Asian Tournaments.
- (iii) First three positions in Recognised National Championships/International Championships organised by the recognised National Federations/IOA.
- (iv) Recognised International Meets/Championships Juniors.
- (v) Asian School Games.
- (vi) A sports person representing All India Central Universities teams in the National Championship.
- (vii) A Sports person holding any of the first three positions in the All India Inter-University Championship.
- (viii) First three positions in the National Championship for women/National Sports Festival for Women by Sports Authority of India.






Tripathi, Joint Secretary, UGC, MHRD, New Delhi in respect of reservation for Economical Weaker Section (EWSs) for admission. In this regard, a meeting under the chairmanship of Vice Chancellor, was held on 19.1.2019 regarding implementation of proposed 10% reservation to the weaker sections of the General Category admission in the University and affiliated colleges.


It was decided in the meeting of DUI, Prof. Navdeep Goyal, F.D.O., Dean Research, and Dean, Faculty of Science on 6.6.2019 (copy enclosed), that the proposed 10% reservation to the Economical weaker sections (EWS) Category admission in the University, is not being considered for funding by U.G.C. (MHRD) Govt. of India, therefore, University will not be in the position to admit EWS candidates.

The members discussed the letter issued by Directorate of Higher Education (DHE), Chandigarh Administration (Administration Branch) Chandigarh dated 24.5.2019 to Govt. Colleges situated in Chandigarh (copy enclosed).



## **FOR COLLEGES OF EDUCATION SITUATED IN CHANDIGARH ONLY**

### **1. GENERAL INFORMATION**

As authorized by of Directorate of Higher Education, Chandigarh Administration, the Panjab University, Chandigarh will conduct Merit-based admission to B.Ed. (General), B.Ed. (Yoga) and B.Ed. Special Education (Intellectual Disability) in Colleges of Education affiliated to Panjab University, Chandigarh and situated in U.T. Chandigarh. The information about Colleges of Education and the number of seats available therein as per approval granted by the National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE), as notified in the Notification of Directorate of Higher Education, Chandigarh Administration Notification No. DHE-UT-C6-26(1)92-III/2713 dated 13.05.2022.

### **2. ELIGIBILITY:**

**A candidate who possesses the following qualifications shall be eligible for admissions to join the course:**

- i.** Candidates with at least 50% Marks either in Bachelor's degree and/or in the Master's degree in Science/Social Sciences/Humanities/Commerce/Home Science/B.B.A/B.C.A, B.A.LL.B., B.Com. LL.B. or any other qualification equivalent thereto, are eligible for admission to the programme. However, while calculating merit, marks obtained in Entrance Test only be considered for admission to B.Ed.  
There shall be a relaxation of 5% marks in favour of SC/ST/PwD candidates. Candidate with less than 45% marks belonging to these categories shall not be eligible.
  - ii.** Bachelors in Engineering or Technology with specialization in Science and Mathematics with 55% marks or any other qualification equivalent thereto, are eligible for admission to the programme. There shall be a relaxation of 5% marks in favour of SC/ST/PwD candidates. Candidate with less than 50% marks belonging to these categories shall not be eligible. However, while calculating merit, marks obtained in Entrance Test only be considered for admission to B.Ed.
  - iii.** The reservation in seats and relaxation in the qualifying marks in favour of the reserved categories shall be as per rules of the Chandigarh Administration.
  - iv.** Provided that such minimum qualifying marks shall not automatically entitle a candidate to get admission in an institution but only entitle the candidate concerned to fulfill other institutional criteria notified by the institution concerned or by the Government concerned from time to time to apply for admission. Offline Admissions will be offered to those candidates who will qualify the Common Entrance Test and provide the options for colleges with subject combination.
- B)** Candidate must have studied the major subject of the subject combination for at least three years at Bachelor's level and/or two years at Master's level.
- Honors students shall opt for major subject in which they have obtained Honors, the minor subject should have been studied at least for one year/one semester.
  - Candidates who have passed B.A.LL.B/ B.Com. LL.B with at least Fifty Percent

marks in a relevant school subject.

- A candidate getting admission on the basis of Post Graduate Degree shall have to opt for major subject in which they have obtained Master Degree.
  - Any candidate who has passed graduation even without a relevant school subject would be eligible **only** for B.Ed Yoga and B.Ed Special Education (Intellectual Disabilities) courses.
- C) Candidates who have appeared for qualifying examination and whose results have not been declared may be provisionally allowed to apply for admission at their own risk and responsibility but they shall become eligible for counseling only after they have produced the evidence of having satisfied the above said conditions on the date of counseling.
- D) Result late (RL)/Re-evaluation/Compartment cases, if their results are declared before final counseling, shall be considered subject to availability of seats only.
- E) In case of students who have done Honours in languages such as Hindi, Punjabi and English, the major subject will be language. Such candidates would be allotted minor subject by the college on the basis of other subject option/s permissible to the candidate by the respective University and the availability of the same in the respective college.

### 3. **ADMISSION POLICY IN COLLEGES OF UNION TERRITORY, CHANDIGARH:**

- i. **UT Pool 60%:** Out of the total sanctioned intake of the institutions, 60% seats will be filled up from amongst the students who have passed **their lower qualifying examination from colleges recognized by the Chandigarh Administration and situated in the Union Territory of Chandigarh as a regular student of the said Colleges/ Institutions,** subject to the condition that such students must have studied for two years in graduation as regular student at Chandigarh. These seats will be termed as ‘**UT Pool**’.
- ii. **General Pool 40%:** Out of the total sanctioned intake of the institutions, **40% seats** will be filled from amongst the students who passed their **lower qualifying examination** from the recognized institutions other than those located in the Union Territory of Chandigarh. These seats will be termed as ‘**General Pool**’. The candidates who have done their graduation/post-graduation through distance mode will be considered under this Pool (**General Pool**) only.

#### 4. **CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION**

- (a) The admission to B.Ed. Course in the colleges situated in Chandigarh and affiliated to Panjab University, Chandigarh, for the session 2022-2024 shall be made on the basis of the Entrance Test Merit and subject to the eligibility criteria for admissions laid down by Panjab University, Chandigarh, NCTE, Chandigarh Administration as per availability of seats in a particular subject combination and as per reservation policy of Chandigarh Administration.

**Note :**No one who is already in employment (whole time or part time whether in honorary capacity or paid) shall be admitted to any of the above mentioned B.Ed. Courses without taking leave from the employer/Institution/office etc. from the date of commencement of the academic session till the completion of course.

- (b) Admission will be done as per Reservation Policy of the Chandigarh Administration.
- (c) When two or more candidates have secured equal marks in the Common Entrance Test, their inter-se merit for admission will be decided on the following criteria:
- i. Candidate with higher percentage of marks in qualifying degree.
  - ii. Candidate older in age shall rank higher in the order of merit.

#### 5. **GENERAL CONDITIONS:**

The admission to various Colleges of Education situated in Chandigarh and affiliated to Panjab University, Chandigarh will be done strictly as per the Notification of Chandigarh Administration No. Notification No. DHE-UT-C6-26(1)92-III/2713 dated 13.05.2022 (Annexure I) and the N.C.T.E. norms.

- i. The reservation of seats as given above shall be strictly adhered to. However, in case seats in a reserved category remain vacant, on account of non-availability of qualified candidates, such seats may be filled up as per policy of Chandigarh Administration.

- ii. **Applicant applying for the reserved category shall carefully indicate the claim for only one category in the admission form.** No change in the category will be entertained /permitted at any stage after submission of information on the website.
- iii. Any incorrect information by the candidate in online form or otherwise provided shall lead to his/her disqualification without any intimation thereof.
- iv. **The minimum qualifying marks in the CET will be 25% for General Category and 20% for SC/ST/Pwd Candidates.**
- v. There will be two face to face counseling sessions for admission. The allocation of college will be made through two face to face counseling only. The shifting of seats will be allowed during the second & subsequent counseling (if any).
- vi. The admission to all seats belonging to different subjects in the Colleges of Education will be done as per the norms laid down by the N.C.T.E as per clause 3.1 of the appendix 4 of its Gazette Notification dated 27.11.2014. The subject combination will be decided by the admission committee constituted by the Panjab University Chandigarh
- vii. During counseling, major subjects would be allotted by the University. Allocation of seat at time of counseling does not mean confirmation of admission. The admission will be confirmed by the concerned college after checking and verification of original documents.
- viii. Colleges shall provide all information regarding the course and other facilities being provided to the students on their website.

## **6. TEACHING SUBJECT COMBINATIONS**

- i. Admission to B.Ed. course is subject based. At the time of admission, each candidate shall opt for two teaching/pedagogical subjects, which has been studied at graduation/post-graduation level. The candidate must have studied the Major subject of the teaching combination for at least three years at graduation level or two years at Master's level. The minor subject should have been studied for at least for one year/one semester.
- ii. The candidates having honours course shall opt for major subject in which they have obtained honours. The minor subject should have been studied at least for one year/one semester.
- iii. The candidates who have passed additional subjects at graduation level can opt for only those teaching subject, marks of which are taken into account for the purpose of calculating percentage of marks at graduation level.
- iv. B.Com./B.B.A./M.Com. graduates /postgraduates may opt for two teaching subjects- one is teaching of commerce and the other shall be teaching of economics/mathematics/any one language i.e. teaching of English/Hindi/Punjabi/Sanskrit.  
**Note:** B.Com/B.B.A. graduates shall be considered in commerce stream only, even they have passed additional arts subjects unless they have passed Masters in Arts.
- v. B.C.A. graduates may opt for teaching of Computer science as one subject. The other subject shall be teaching of Mathematics or any one language (English/Punjabi/Hindi/Sanskrit)
- vi. B.E./B.Tech. graduates shall opt for any two subject combination out of teaching of Mathematics, Computer Science, Science, Languages.
- vii. B.Sc.(Home Science) graduates shall opt for two teaching subjects. One is Teaching of Home Science, other may be subject studied at graduate level i.e. Science or any one language ( English/Hindi/Punjabi/Sanskrit).
- viii. B.Sc(Medical) graduates shall opt for two teaching subjects out of the following:
  - (a) Teaching of Science/ Life Science;

- (b) Teaching of Physical Science;  
(c) Teaching of any one language i.e. English/Hindi/Punjabi/Sanskrit.
- ix. B.Sc(Non-Medical) graduates shall opt for two teaching subjects out of the following:  
(a) Teaching of Science/Physical Science;  
(b) Teaching of Mathematics/Computer Science;  
(c) Teaching of any one language i.e. English/Hindi/Punjabi/Sanskrit.
- x. Arts Graduates may opt for any two pedagogical subjects one each from the following (a) and (b):  
(a) Teaching of Social Studies/Economics/History/Geography/Political Science/Sociology/Public administration/Fine Arts/Physical Education/Music/Home Science.  
(b) Teaching of any one language i.e. English, Punjabi, Hindi, Sanskrit provided that the candidate has studied the subject at the graduation/post-graduation level.
- xi. Graduates with Fine Arts/Music/Computer Science/Home Science/Physical Education/Mathematics/Statistics/Quantitative techniques shall opt for any of these subjects with the other subject combinations available in the college.

**Note:** Teaching of Fine Arts shall be offered to a candidate who had taken up Fine Arts/Performing Arts/Fashion Design/Fashion Technology or B.A. with Diploma in Drawing and Painting or Arts and Craft Teacher's course from a recognized institution.

- xii. Teaching of Social Studies shall be opted by those who have studied any one of these subjects at B.A./M.A. level i.e. (i) History (ii) Geography (iii) Political Science(iv) Sociology (v) Economics (vi) Public Administration(vii) Philosophy (viii) Psychology (ix) Education(x) Defence Studies (xi) Religious Studies
- xiii. B.A.LL.B. Graduate shall opt for two teaching subjects which they have studied during the course, major for at least two/three years and minor for at least one year/one semester.
- xiv. A candidate getting admission on the basis of Post graduate degree shall have to opt for one of teaching subjects pursued by him/her at Master degree

Note: 1. The candidates shall be given the required subject combination depending upon their availability in the colleges.

2. Candidates who have passed Shastri/Gyani/Parbhakar/Honours in a language/Elective subjects in languages can opt for two language combinations provided they have studied the other language for at least one year/one semester at graduation/post-graduation level.

All eligible candidates with any subject combination shall be eligible to seek admission to B.Ed. Yoga.

### **B.Ed. Special Education (Intellectual Disability)**

**Govt. Rehabilitation Institute for Intellectual Disabilities, Chandigarh (GRRID), Sec. 31- C, Chandigarh.**

B.A. / B.Sc. / B.Com. or an equivalent degree at graduate level depending on the requirements of being the school subject for pedagogical courses, can take admissions to B.Ed. Special Education (Intellectual Disability). In this course, a candidate has to select any two school teaching subjects during the course of study, i.e. language (Hindi, English & Punjabi) and school subjects (Science, Maths & Social Sciences). All Admissions will be done as per the Reservation Policies of Union Territory of Chandigarh and Panjab University, Chandigarh.

## **7. RESERVATION OF SEATS**

**The RESERVATION POLICY for Chandigarh Colleges is as follows:-**

A candidate applying in the Reserved Categories shall carefully indicate his/her claim for category in the Admission Form. **No change of category will be entertained/permitted** in the application form or otherwise at a later stage.

**A. UT Pool 60%:** Out of the total sanctioned intake of the institutions **60% seats** will be filled up from amongst the students who passed their qualifying examination from colleges recognized by the Chandigarh Administration and situated in the Union Territory of Chandigarh as a regular student of the said Colleges/ Institutions, subject to the condition that such students must have studied **for two years at Chandigarh. These seats will be termed as 'UT Pool'.**

**B. General Pool 40%:** Out of the total sanctioned intake of the institutions **40% seats** will be filled from amongst the students who pass their qualifying examination from the institutions other than those located in the Union Territory of Chandigarh. These seats will be termed as **'General Pool'. Students who have passed their qualifying examination through distance mode will be considered in General pool only.**

### **Reservation:**

#### **❖ Scheduled Castes/ Scheduled Tribes**

The following percentage of seats is prescribed for the students belonging to Scheduled

**Castes and Scheduled Tribes:**

**U.T. Pool:**

Scheduled Caste – 15%

Scheduled Tribes – NIL

**General Pool:**

Scheduled Caste – 15%

Scheduled Tribes – 7.5%

If the requisite number of students of SC category in the UT Pool is not available, the seats will be made open to the students belonging to General category of the said pool. If the requisite number of students belonging to SC/ST categories is not available, the reservation will be interchangeable amongst the students of these communities. However, if the seats still remain unfilled, these will be made open amongst the students of the General category of the said-pool.

- ❖ **Ex-Serviceman, Dependents of Defence/ Para-Military Personnel etc:**  
**5% of the seats in each pool would be filled in from the following categories of students in order of preference:**

(a) Sons/ daughters/spouses of the defence personnel who are awardees of gallantry decorations of Paramvir / Mahavir / Vir Chakra in person or posthumously OR Sons/ daughters/spouses of the defence personnel and Para-military personnel like CRPF, BSF etc. who are killed or are totally incapacitated in action while in service and were wholly dependent on them.

(b) Sons/daughters/spouses of the Defence and Para-military personnel like CRPF, BSF etc. who died while in service and were wholly dependent on them.

(c) Sons/daughters/spouses of the defence and Para-military personnel like CRPF, BSF etc. incapacitated while in service and were wholly dependent on them.

(d) Sons/daughters/spouses of ex-serviceman (defence and Para-military personnel like CRPF, BSF etc.) that are wholly dependent on them.

(e) Sons/daughters/spouses of serving defence and Para-military personnel like CRPF, BSF etc. who are wholly dependent on them.

**NOTE:**

- i) The applicants seeking admission under categories (a) are required to submit the photocopy of citation for gallantry award, failing which they will not be considered for this category.
- ii) The applicants under category (b) and (c) are required to submit the certificate from the respective headquarters regarding death or total incapacitation while in service.
- iii) The applicants seeking admission to category (d) are required to submit discharge certificate from service and certificate of dependence from the **Director Zila Sainik Board.**



- iv) The applicants claiming admission under category (e) are required to submit the certificate of dependence from the unit in which parent/ spouse is serving.

#### ❖ **Persons with Disability (PwD)**

5% seats in each pool would be filled from amongst the Persons with Disability candidates (1% each to be reserved for persons suffering from (i) Blindness or loss of vision (ii) Hearing impairment (iii) Locomotor disability or cerebral palsy). The students having temporary disability would not be considered against reserved seats. Eligible candidates will furnish a medical fitness certificate on the prescribed proforma from a Government Gazetted Medical Officer alongwith the application indicating percentage of disability whether he/she is otherwise able to carry on the studies and perform the duties of a teacher, name of the disease causing disability, whether disability is temporary or permanent, whether disability is progressive or non-progressive. Only such candidates whose disability is above **40%are eligible**. If such a certificate is not attached with the application, the candidate will not be considered for the seats reserved for this category.

The candidates selected provisionally for admission under this category will have to appear before the Medical Board constituted by the Principal Medical Officer, General Hospital, Sector 16, Chandigarh, for determining the percentage of disability / disability. The final selection will be made on the basis of the certificate issued by the Medical Doctor/Board. If the candidate does not present himself/ herself before the Medical Doctor/Board on the date intimated to him/her, his/her candidature against this category will be rejected and no subsequent opportunity will be given to him/her.

The members of persons with disability including blind and hearing impaired shall be allowed a relaxation of 5% marks for admission to the courses in which a certain percentage of minimum marks has been prescribed, provided they have obtained minimum pass marks prescribed by the regulations. (*Revised Guidelines for Reserved Category of Persons with Disabilities Candidates, No. 3500-3599/DUI/DS dated 01/07/2016*)

#### ❖ **Children and Grandchildren of Freedom Fighters**

**2%** seats from each pool will be filled from the children and grandchildren of freedom fighters.

- (a) A freedom fighter is a person who has either been granted freedom fighter pension by the Chandigarh Administration or has been awarded “**TamraPatra**” by Government of India for his political sufferings. No person other than the above mentioned persons will be considered as freedom fighter for the purpose of reservation in admission. The requisite certificate will be issued by the **Deputy Commissioner, Chandigarh**, which will be considered irrespective of the form in which it is issued, provided it is self-explanatory.
- (b) Grand children mean son’s sons/daughters or daughter’s sons/ daughters.
- (c) The wards of freedom fighters who have been awarded “**TamraPatras**” by the Government of India would also be eligible for reservation under this category. In the case of such freedom fighters they should produce their “**TamraPatras**” **certificate, freedom fighter certificate and dependence certificate from the Deputy Commissioner of the district in which they reside.**

**NOTE:** The applicants from this category will not be considered without the following documents:

- i) The photocopy of “TamraPatra” certificate or freedom fighter certificate.

- ii) Dependence certificate from the concerned Deputy Commissioner.

❖ **Sportsmen/ Sportswomen**

- (a) **2%** seats would be filled with sportsmen or sportswomen on the basis of their merits as per grading criteria forwarded by the Chandigarh Administration. This category shall not be divided into UT Pool/General Pool.

Benefits of reservation under this category shall be available only to the following categories of the students:-

- (i) Who passed their qualifying examination from colleges recognised by Chandigarh Administration and situated in the Union Territory of Chandigarh as a regular student of the said college, who have studied in Chandigarh colleges for at least two years before applying for gradation certificate subject to the condition that such students must represent Chandigarh state etc. in the national/ other recognised tournaments.
- (ii) Where Chandigarh Administration has adopted the notification of other States/ U.T.s on reciprocal basis to give benefits of reservation in admission in Sports Category in Chandigarh, they will be graded as per existing policy of Chandigarh Administration.
- (iii) Countersigning of Gradation certificates shall only be admissible on reciprocal basis provided that counter signed certificates will be graded as per policy of Chandigarh Administration.

The gradation for Sports person is as under, which should not be before 1<sup>st</sup> April, 2019.

**NOTE: (c)** Students seeking admission to this category shall be considered only:

- (i) If his/her age falls within the age group which is eligible for participation in the Inter-College/ Inter-University Tournaments.

- (ii) If his/her achievement in sports relates to his/her activity in any of the three years preceding admission. (For example, for admission in the year 2022-24, the achievements shall not be prior to the 1st April, 2019 or as per the decision of the Chandigarh Administration)

❖ **Foreign students**

2% seats are reserved for foreign students in B.Ed. course. The foreign students should submit along with their application the following documents without which they will not be considered for admission under this category:

- (i) Eligibility Certificate: If a student is seeking admission on the basis of foreign qualification.
- (ii) Long term student Visa
- (iii) Proof of foreign Nationality

**NOTE:**

- (i) Foreign students residing abroad should apply through their respective Embassies to the Secretary, Govt. of India, Ministry of External Affairs, New Delhi.
- (ii) Foreign Students desirous of seeking admission to B.Ed. Course who is in India will compete amongst themselves for the seats created for them. Those living and applying from abroad shall be required to produce the test score of the Graduate Record Examination (GRE) from Princeton USA. Foreign Candidates shall also have to comply with all the requirements of Government of India, Chandigarh U.T. Administration as well as Panjab University as prescribed by them from time to time.

Admission of the foreign students to the college is governed by the guidelines issued by the Dean, Foreign Students, Panjab University, and Chandigarh.

**OVER AND ABOVE (Additional) SEATS:**

❖ **Reservation for Economically Weaker Sections (EWS) 10% over and above the sanctioned seats\* (Specimen Performa attached in appendix-B)**

\*in compliance of letter vide the Home Department, Chandigarh Administration order no. 19/1/3-IH (3)-2019/4185 dated 01/05/2019, endorsed by Director Higher Education vide Endst.No. 239-DHE-UT-Ad.II-26(11) 2000-3 dated 24.05.2019

- i. There is 10% reservation for the Economically Weaker Section for admission to City Colleges over and above the sanctioned seats. The persons belonging to Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) from all over India would get benefit of 10% reservation in seats over and above the sanctioned intake for Admission in the Educational/ Technical/ Medical Institutions of Union Territory, Chandigarh.
- ii. Persons who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservations for the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes and whose family has gross annual income below Rs. 8 lakhs are to be identified as EWSs for the benefit of reservation. Income shall also include income from all sources i.e. salary, agriculture, business, profession, etc. for the financial year prior to the year of application. Also persons whose family owns or possesses any of

the following assets shall be excluded from being identified as EWSs, irrespective of the family income:-

- i. 5 acres of Agricultural Land and above;
  - ii. Residential flat of 1000 sq. ft. and above;
  - iii. Residential plot of 100 sq. yards and above in notified municipalities;
  - iv. Residential plot of 200 sq. yards and above in areas other than the notified municipalities.
- iii. The benefit of reservation under EWS can be availed upon production of an Income and Asset Certificate issued by a Competent Authority. The Income and Asset Certificate issued 'by any one of the following authorities in the prescribed format shall only be accepted as proof of candidate's claim as 'belonging to EWS:
- 
- (i) District Magistrate/Additional District Magistrate/ Collector/ Deputy Commissioner/Additional Deputy Commissioner/ 1<sup>st</sup> Class Stipendiary Magistrate/ Sub-Divisional Magistrate/ Taluka Magistrate/ Executive Magistrate/ Extra Assistant Commissioner
  - (ii) Chief Presidency Magistrate/Additional Chief Presidency Magistrate/ Presidency Magistrate
  - (iii) Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar and
  - (iv) Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the candidate and/or his family normally resides.

**The reservation policy and seats as given above shall be strictly adhered to. In case seats in a reserved category remain vacant on account of non-availability of qualified candidates such seats may be filled up from the General category. The candidate who had applied for a reserved category will be considered for that particular category only.**

**This reservation is in accordance to the Home Policy of Chandigarh Administration, Chandigarh.**

**Note:**

**As and when there is a change in the Home Policy or University rules, it will be incorporated in the admission policy and intimated to the students and displayed on the notice board also.**

## 8. **IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS TO CANDIDATES**

- **The candidates are advised to follow the procedure laid down for online registration and application form submission.**
- Incomplete forms will not be given any chance for completion after the last date mentioned on the website link “*Important Dates*”.
- It is the responsibility of the candidate to ensure that correct information is provided when the online form is filled. **Any incorrect information will lead to disqualification.** No request for correction will be entertained once form/information is submitted online.
- Candidates applying for the reserved category shall carefully indicate the claim for category in the Online Admission Form. No change of category will be entertained or permitted at a later stage.
- **Please read instructions clearly for claim of U.T. pool (60%) and General pool (40%).**
- **Candidate is required to deposit fee of Rs. 2400/- (Rs. 1200/- for SC/ST/PwD)** before the last date mentioned on the website link “*Important Dates*”. Candidate can pay fee online or deposit in any SBI branch located in India.
- Candidates applying for the reserved category shall carefully indicate the claim for only one category in the admission form to be submitted through online process.
- Any change of information in the Online Admission Form once submitted on the website will not be entertained.
- Common Entrance Test (CET) will be held as per schedule on the website link “*Important Dates*”.
- ADMIT CARDS carrying the roll numbers will be issued to the candidates provisionally and will be available under candidates Login in, subject to the final confirmation of their eligibility. It is further clarified that the candidates shall be taking the Entrance Test at their own risk and responsibility as per a their eligibility is concerned and the university shall, in no way, be responsible if they are found ineligible later, leading to cancellation of their results or any other circumstance(s) emanating from the same.
- The candidate shall be allowed for the test only on the production of the Admit Card along with one Photo Identity Card at the Centre. No candidate shall be allowed to take the entrance test without the admit card in any circumstances.
- If there is any problem in downloading the admit card form the website, the candidate should send the email at [chandigarhbed@pu.ac.in](mailto:chandigarhbed@pu.ac.in) or personally visit B.Ed Entrance Test Cell at Panjab University, Chandigarh.
- **The minimum qualifying marks in B.Ed-CET-2022 will be 25% for General Category and 20% for SC/ST/Pwd Candidates.**
- Once the online Application form is submitted, the candidate shall not be allowed to make any

change in the Application Form by way of any addition/deletion/alteration/amendment/change of any particular etc. under any circumstance whatsoever.

- The result of the Entrance Test will be published by Panjab University, Chandigarh and will be displayed on the University website (<http://results.puchd.ac.in> )
- The merit of each candidate shall be determined on the basis of marks secured by him or her in the **Common Entrance Test**.
- The admission will be made strictly on the basis of merit.
- Two “**face to face counseling**” will be conducted by Panjab University, Chandigarh . The candidates must check the schedule from the website <https://chandigarhbed.puchd.ac.in> regularly.
- The allocation of seats for admissions to B.Ed. for session 2022-2024 shall be based on the merit.
- Duration of B.Ed. programme shall be of Two years, spread over four semesters, which can be completed in a maximum of Three years from the date of admission to the programme as per NCTE Regulations/Notification.
- The admission and allocation of college will be made through face to face/Offline counseling by the authorized committee. The candidate should appear before the counseling committee in virtual mode. Face to face/offline counseling schedule will be notified by the University.
- The reservation of seats shall be strictly adhered to, however, in case seats in a reserved category remain vacant, on account of non-availability of qualified candidates, such seats may be filled up as per Chandigarh Administration policy. However, one time shifting will be allowed during second counseling only on the charges specified by the university.
- The decision taken by the advisory committee constituted by the Vice Chancellor will be final with regard to the process of filling up of seats remaining vacant after the completion of second counseling.
- Candidates having CGPA score in qualifying examination are required to fill the marks by converting their CGPA score into marks using approved formula of respective University. Candidate is also required to bring approved formula for conversion of CGPA score at the time of counseling. #### 11. EXAMINATION RELATED INSTRUCTIONS:

- I. The result of the Entrance Test shall, *ipso facto*, not entitle a candidate to get admission in an institution/ department/ centre concerned where he/she intends to seek admission. It will be the responsibility of the candidate to make sure about his/her eligibility and fulfillment of such other conditions as may be prescribed for admission in the rules and regulations of University/Institution concerned. Merely because a candidate is allowed to appear in the Entrance Test does not mean that he/she is eligible and his/ her appearance therein will not stop or debar the university/ institution concerned from satisfying itself about his/her eligibility at any subsequent stage.
- II. Notwithstanding anything contained in this booklet, the eligibility conditions for admission to the B.Ed. Course shall be governed by the Regulations/rules as enshrined in the Calendar of the Panjab University, Chandigarh. Instructions/ Notifications issued by the Chandigarh Administration and N.C.T.E. (National Council for Teacher Education), Panjab University, Chandigarh will be applicable.
- III. The Entrance Test will be held on **21/08/2022** from 10.30 a.m. to 12.30 p.m.
- IV. There will be one paper of 120 marks and paper contains five parts (Part A to Part E).
- V. **Part A, B, C & D are compulsory consisting of 25 marks each. Part E is optional, candidates shall opt one language out of Hindi or Punjabi. The candidate shall carefully fill (darken the correct bubble corresponding to the opted language i.e. Hindi or Punjabi) in the OMR sheet. Part E consist is of 20 marks.**
- VI. **Part E will not be evaluated in case the candidate do not fill any of the language option (Hindi or Punjabi) or fill both of the language option. The candidate shall be responsible for not following the instructions carefully.**
- VII. **There will be no negative marking.**
- VIII. The candidate has to report at Test Centre 30 minutes before the start of Test.
- IX. The medium of examination in respect of Question Booklets shall be in English, Hindi and Punjabi medium except for Language Proficiency Test which shall be set in the respective Languages. However, there will be single OMR sheet.
- X. **Special arrangements for amanuensis (writer of answer):**
  - i. A candidate may be allowed help of an amanuensis (writer) if he/she is: Blind
  - ii. Permanently disabled from writing with his/her own hand.

OR

  - iii. Temporarily disabled from writing on account of fracture of the right or left arm, forearm or dislocation of a shoulder elbow or wrist etc. The candidate shall produce a certificate from a Professor of the specialty concerned of a Medical College and where there is no Medical College, from the Chief Medical officer of the District concerned to the effect that the candidate is unable to write his/her answer-books because of the temporary disablement.
- XI. 40 minutes extra would be given to the visually handicapped/persons with disability (PwD).
- XII. The candidates shall be required to answer the questions only on the OMR sheet

provided for the purpose, strictly as per instructions given on the title page of the question booklet and OMR sheet.

- XIII. There will be four options specified against each question i.e. A, B, C, and D out of which only one is correct. The candidate shall fill only one of the bubbles marked A or B or C or D against the relevant question using Black ball pen only.
- XIV. The OMR Sheet is designed for computer evaluation. Please follow the instructions given on the answer sheet so that computer evaluates it correctly.
- XV. For making answers, use Black pen only. The shading should be dark enough and should fill the bubble completely so that letter/number inside it is not visible.
- XVI. Each question has four choices labeled as A, B, C, and D. Select only one Choice you think is the best response and darken the bubble bearing it.
- XVII. Every candidate is required to hand over both the OMR Answer Sheet and the Question Booklet to the Centre Superintendent/Invigilator when the time allowed for the Entrance Test is over, even if she/he has not attempted any question. No page/part of the Question Booklet/ OMR Answer Sheet is to be removed/ torn/taken out of the

- Test Centre under any circumstances, failing which the candidate shall be straight disqualified from the Entrance Test.
- XVIII. The use of calculators is not allowed.
- XIX. No candidate shall be allowed to leave the examination hall/room before the expiry of the time allotted for the respective paper.
- XX. Rough work, if any, is to be done only in the space provided in the Question Booklet and nowhere else. No rough work shall be done on the OMR Answer Sheet under any circumstances.
- XXI. Any candidate who carries any telecommunication equipment such as pager, cellular phone, wireless set, Bluetooth device, etc. inside the examination hall shall be expelled from the examination hall & disqualified.
- XXII. The candidates must bring their own stationary items such as Black Ball Pen. Borrowing of material inside the Test Centre is strictly prohibited.
- XXIII. There shall be *no re-evaluation/re-checking/re-assessment* of answer-sheets under any of the circumstances. Request for seeing the Question Booklet / Answer Sheets by the candidates shall not be entertained at all. The evaluation once done by the University shall be absolutely final.
- XXIV. In case of Objective Type question papers, the candidate must ensure that the answers to the questions are attempted on the specifically prescribed OMR Answer Sheet only. No answer attempted on the Question Booklet will be considered for evaluation. Only those questions answered on the OMR sheet shall be taken into account.
- XXV. PREPARATION OF MERIT LIST**  
The Merit list will be prepared in following manner:
- i. The minimum qualifying marks in B.Ed.-CET-2022 will be 25% for General Category students and 20% for SC/ST/PwD candidates.
  - ii. Quota-wise, Category-wise and Course wise Merit lists will be prepared.
- XXVI. RESOLVING OF TIES**  
When two or more candidates have secured equal marks in the Common Entrance Test their inter-se merit for admission will be decided on the following criteria:
- i. Candidate with higher percentage of marks in qualifying degree.
  - ii. Candidate older in age shall rank higher in the order of merit.
- XXVII. Candidates are not allowed to carry eatables, drinks etc. into the Test Centre. Smoking inside and around the Centre is not permitted.
- XXVIII. Any candidate who creates disturbance of any kind during examination or otherwise misbehaves in or around the examination hall or refuses to obey the Superintendent/Deputy Superintendent/Assistant Superintendent /any other official on examination duty or changes his/her seat with any other candidate or occupies any seat, other than the one allotted to him/her shall be expelled from the examination hall. (“Expulsion” for this purpose would mean cancellation of the Entire Entrance Test). The Centre Superintendent/Observer/any other authorized University Officer/Official shall be competent to expel a candidate from the examination centre.
- XXIX. Any candidate having in his/her possession or accessible to him/her paper/books or notes which may possibly be of any assistance to him/her or is found giving or receiving assistance, or copying from any paper/book or note or from anywhere else or allowing any other candidate to copy from his/her answer book or found writing on any other paper, questions set in the question paper, during examination or using or attempting to use any other unfair means or indulging in any kind of misconduct shall be expelled from the examination hall. (“Expulsion” for this purpose would mean cancellation of the Entire Entrance Test). The Centre Superintendent/Observer/any

- other authorized University Officer/Official shall be competent to expel a candidate from the examination centre.
- XXX. If any Answer Sheet of a candidate shows or it is otherwise established that he/she has received or attempted to receive help from any source in any manner or has given help or attempted to give help to any other candidate in any manner, the relevant Answer Sheet shall be cancelled. The cancellation of the Answer Sheet shall mean cancellation of all Answer Sheets of the Common Entrance Test. The decision of the advisory committee constituted by the Vice Chancellor, Panjab University, Chandigarh in this regard shall be final.
- XXXI. If a candidate writes his/her name or puts any kind of identification mark or discloses his/her identity by any method whatsoever on the cover or anywhere else in the Question Booklet/Answer Sheet, the same shall be treated as cancelled. The cancellation of the Answer Sheet shall mean cancellation of all Answer Sheets of the Entrance Test. The decision of the Controller of Examinations, Panjab University, Chandigarh in this regard shall be final.
- XXXII. Any person, who impersonates a candidate, shall be disqualified from appearing in any Panjab University examination for a period of five years including this Entrance Test, if that person is a student on the rolls of a recognised School or College or University. But if the person is not on the rolls of a recognised School or College or University, s/he shall be declared as a person not fit and proper to be admitted to any examination of the Panjab University for a period of 5 years. The case, if necessary, shall also be reported to the police for any further action in the matter.
- XXXIII. If it is found that a candidate has knowingly or willfully concealed or suppressed any information/fact which renders him/her ineligible to take the Entrance Test, his/her result of the Test as also admission to an Institution/Department/Centre of the University, if granted, shall stand cancelled and he/she shall have no claim whatsoever against the Institution/Department/Centre concerned and the case, if necessary shall be reported to the police.
- XXXIV. If a dispute or controversy of any kind arises before, during or after conduct of Entrance Test, the decision of the advisory committee constituted by the Vice Chancellor, Panjab University, Chandigarh, in all such cases, shall be final.
- XXXV. The candidates shall be admitted to the test only on the production of the Admit Card along with photo Identity card/proof at the Test Centre. No candidate shall be allowed to take the test without the Admit Card under any circumstances. The candidates must retain the Admit Card with them till the admission process is over, since it will be required again at the time of counselling.
- XXXVI. The Admit Cards will be issued to the candidates only provisionally, at their sole risk and responsibility subject to the final confirmation of their eligibility at the time of admission. It is further clarified that the candidates shall be taking the test at their own risk and responsibility as far as their eligibility is concerned and the University shall, in no way, be responsible if they are found to be ineligible, later, leading to cancellation of their result or any other consequence(s) emanating from the same.
